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Requirements for the NSW Record of School Achievement

In years 9 and 10 students' achievements count towards the Record of School Achievement (RoSA). The RoSA is a **cumulative credential** in that it allows students to accumulate their academic results until they leave school or qualify for the HSC. The RoSA records completed Stage 5 and Preliminary Stage 6 courses and grades, and participation in any uncompleted Preliminary Stage 6 courses.

To qualify for the RoSA, a student must have:

- attended a government school, an accredited non-government school or a recognised school outside NSW;
- completed courses of study that satisfy the Board's curriculum and assessment requirements for the RoSA;
- complied with all requirements imposed by the Minister or the Board; and
- completed Year 10.

Students leaving school who do not meet the RoSA requirements will be issued with a printed Transcript of Study.

NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA)

Lithgow High School Stage 5 Assessment Policy

Nature and purpose of assessment

Assessment of student achievement is integral to teaching and learning. It involves collecting information and making reliable judgements about student performance in relation to the objectives and related outcomes of the course. A variety of assessment tasks are provided at points during each course in order to collect evidence of student achievement. Such evidence is useful in that it:

- Provides diagnostic information
- Assists students with their learning
- Determines future teaching directions, and
- Reports on the extent of student achievement of course outcomes.

NAPLAN

The school strongly recommends all students sit the NAPLAN test as the individual student results provide diagnostic information about areas for improvement and can assist the school and parents in providing appropriate education pathways.

Student Responsibilities

Students are required to:

- Attend all timetabled classes
- Support the learning of others and behave in an appropriate manner
- Read and comply with the school's assessment policy
- Attempt each task to the best of their ability
- Seek clarification on any misunderstanding regarding the assessment task notification
- Plan and prioritise the completion of assessment tasks
- Resolve any concerns about marks within a reasonable timeframe after the task is returned
- Complete set work after periods of absence

How Parents can assist

Parents can help their child by:

- Ensuring their child has all the equipment needed for class work and assessment tasks
- Display the summary sheets in a prominent location in the home
- Help their child develop organisation and management skills to complete tasks on time
- Communicate any concerns with Teachers or Head Teachers regarding class work
- Attend parent information night and parent teacher evenings for feedback

Variations from Published Assessment Program

Should it be necessary in unforeseen circumstances to change the date of an assessment task, the Head Teacher will negotiate a new date and advise students in writing.

Invalid or Unreliable Tasks

If a task is deemed to be invalid, the marks will still be recorded but an alternative task will be devised and conducted at an appropriate time following consultation with teachers and students or the weighing of the course assessment schedule may require adjusting.

Handing in Assessment Tasks

All tasks are required to be handed in by the set due date on the assessment notification. Students are required to read their assessment notification and follow the instructions outlined. Students may be given the following options for handing in tasks:

- Tasks in class, will be handed in at the end of the period
- Tasks can be collected in person by the teacher, email, uploading into school google classroom, or delivered to the school front office

Late Tasks

Students who do not hand in an assessment task on or before the due date will receive a penalty. **For each day late students will have a 10% penalty** until there is only 10% left of remaining marks. Late tasks will be marked out of the original score, then the penalty will be applied.

Absence during Assessment Tasks / Examinations

If a student is absent on the date an assessment/exam is set, then it is their responsibility to approach their teacher to determine the outcome for catch up. If the absence is known in advance, students can hand in or completed their task early. Students can apply for extension of assessment task for valid reasons as determined by the Head Teacher of the faculty. If a student is absent due to illness or misadventure then they can use the *Application for Consideration / Extension* form to either:

- Have an estimate given
- Sit an alternate test, or
- Receive an extension for the task.

Where student absence is unexplained for an assessment task or examination, then the student will receive a **zero result** for that task or examination. Students will also receive a warning letter regarding non-completion of course requirements.

Malpractice

When a student is involved in malpractice he/she will be awarded a **zero** for that task. Malpractice could include cases of cheating or where the work presented is not the student's own work. Students must not submit large pieces of work taken directly from the internet or other books and sources. Work submitted should be in the student's own words.

Students found to not comply with examination rules will also be awarded a **zero** for that exam.

'N' Determinations

Students may be awarded an 'N' Determination in one or more subjects because they are deemed as not satisfying the requirements for the subject. For a student to satisfactorily complete a course, the Board of Studies requires the principal to have sufficient evidence that the student has:

- (a) followed the course developed or endorsed by the Board; and
- (b) applied him/herself with diligence and sustained effort to the set tasks and experiences provided in the course by the school; and
- (c) achieved some or all of the course outcomes

'N' Determination Warning Letters

An N Determination warning letter is issued to students who fail to complete assessment tasks or who fail to show diligence and sustained effort which may be a result of poor attendance. Students are given a set time to complete the work or demonstrate competencies or complete a work placement. Once the specified work has been completed the warning is redeemed. If the student does not subsequently meet course requirements as detailed in at least **two N Determination Warning Letters**, then an N Determination may be given for the course by the Principal. This means that the student will receive no marks in that course, therefore jeopardising their RoSA. Students have the right to appeal against an 'N' determination and information regarding this will be sent to the student in the event of an 'N' determination.

All My Own Work

Students complete the NESA program *All my own work* in year 10 and are reminded of the following guidelines:

All work presented in assessment tasks and external examinations (including submitted works and practical examinations) must be the student's own or must be acknowledged appropriately. Malpractice, including plagiarism, could lead to a mark of zero and a non-award in the Higher School Certificate. Malpractice includes, but is not limited to:

- copying someone else's work in part or in whole, and presenting it as your own, including using material directly from books, journals, CDs or the internet without reference to the source:
- building on the ideas of another person without reference to the source;
- buying, stealing or borrowing another person's work and presenting it as your own;
- submitting work to which another person such as a parent, coach or subject expert has contributed substantially;
- using words, ideas, designs or the workmanship of others in practical and performance tasks without appropriate acknowledgement or paying someone to write or prepare material;
- breaching school examination rules or using non-approved aides during an assessment task;
- contriving false explanations to explain work not handed in by the due date; or
- assisting another student to engage in malpractice.

Students transferring from other schools

A student who transfers from another school in Year 10 may have their performance addressed in the following ways:

- a) using information from the previous school
- b) if this information is not available, remaining assessment tasks at Lithgow High School will be scaled to the total assessment value
- c) if the transfer occurs after 30th June in the year, the assessment from the previous school will be used by NESA to determine RoSA grades

Grading

The school uses the results from assessment tasks in conjunction with the guidelines provided by NESA as a guide for allocating grades. The grade (A - E) which is awarded will reflect the student's rank in each course and which best describes each student's level of achievement at the end of Year 10. The General Performance Descriptors provide a general idea of what each grade means.

Each course has a more particular set of Performance Descriptors relating to that course.

- A The student has an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a very high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations.
- B The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations.
- The student has a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills.
- **D** The student has a basic knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved a limited level of competence in the processes and skills.
- E The student has an elementary knowledge and understanding in few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills.
