



# Year 7 Peer Support Program Update




This Term the Year 7 Peer Support Program will focus on "Strengthening our Students Connections." Each fortnight Year 7 students will participate in small group lessons conducted by our trained Year 10 Peer Support Leaders. Our Leaders will work through a range of activities focusing on building connections and addressing a range of behaviours including the prevention of bullying. Meeting in small groups allows meaningful connections to form. The students acknowledge their strengths and learn skills to build resilience, identify how to develop, maintain and repair friendships, whilst developing an understanding of a range of behaviours. They also learn strategies on how to respond appropriately in a variety of situations. The Peer Support program supplements the Lithgow High School "Expect Respect" initiative.



The library also provides supervision from 3.30pm – 5.00pm afternoons, Monday through to Thursday with tutors and teachers each day.


We are here to provide Support, Motivation and Stress Management during the Senior Years. A variety of resources are available for students to borrow.



On This Day in History - 25th August, 1944

#### **Paris Liberated**

After more than four years of Nazi occupation, Paris is liberated by the French 2nd Armoured Division and the U.S. 4th Infantry Division. German resistance was light, and General Dietrich von Choltitz, commander of the German garrison, defied an order by Adolf Hitler to blow up Paris' landmarks and burn the city to the ground before its liberation. Choltitz signed a formal surrender that afternoon, and on August 26, Free French General Charles de Gaulle led a joyous liberation march down the Champs d'Elysees (as seen in image).

# Safety Alert: Aerosol Deodorants, Sprays and Perfumes

Some members of the Lithgow High School community suffer severe allergies to aerosol sprays or perfumes that can act as a trigger to an (often)-serious asthma attack, or bring on a severe migraine in a sensitive individual. The allergy can be sufficiently serious to put a student into anaphylactic shock if an aerosol can has been used anywhere in the student's vicinity. This can be a life threatening situation, resulting in the student being transported to hospital in an ambulance.

- Aerosols are banned from school premises, excursions, sporting events and all events where students are in confined spaces.
- Students are encouraged to follow correct hygiene procedures by applying deodorant at home after showering: a good deodorant will last all day if applied to clean skin before dressing
- Roll-on and stick deodorants are permitted at school

Let's Help to Create an Asthma Friendly school. This means that everyone needs to be aware of their own:

- · right to a safe learning environment
- responsibility for the health and safety of others in their shared spaces

Remember: No student is to use or bring aerosol deodorants or sprays to school.

Teachers have been asked to confiscate any aerosol products found at school and bring them to the Deputy Principal. Parents will be informed that the products have been collected from their son or daughter and that they can call into the school and collect the product. Further infringements will be dealt with through the discipline system.

Lithgow High School will transition to the new NSW Public Schools' finance system and a new bank account on **4 September 2017**.

To ensure a smooth transition, there will be changes to the way we accept payments from parents and carers.

- Direct deposits: As of 25 August 2017, we will no longer accept direct deposits into
  our current school bank account as we prepare to close this account and transition to
  the new one. Any payments made using direct deposit after this date cannot be
  properly allocated to a student's account in a timely manner. Please ensure you have
  made any outstanding direct deposits before 11th August 2017.
- EFTPOS payments: We will not be able to accept EFTPOS payments between 30
   August and 4 September 2017. Please ensure that you have made any outstanding
   EFTPOS payments before 30 August 2017. From 5 September 2017, EFTPOS
   payments will be accepted as before.
- 3. Cash and cheque payments: Between 30 August 2017 and 5 September 2017, we will also not be able to accept payments by cash or cheque as we prepare to close our current bank account and transition to the new one. Please ensure that you have made any outstanding cash or cheque payments before 30 August 2017. From 5 September 2017, cash and cheque payments will be accepted as before.
- 4. Online payments: As of 4 September 2017, we will begin to accept online payments using the Department of Education's Parent Online Payment (POP) system. A button to access this online payment system titled '\$ Make a Payment' will be visible on the utility bar on the front page of our school's website at <a href="http://www.lithgow-h.schools.nsw.edu.au/">http://www.lithgow-h.schools.nsw.edu.au/</a> By selecting this link, parents and carers will be taken to a secure Westpac QuickWeb payment page, from which they can make online payments.

Please note: As a Westpac-hosted solution, cardholder and account details will be held securely, helping to protect the school and its customers from fraudulent transactions as well as assisting in meeting the Payment Card Industry Data Security Standard (PCIDSS) compliance requirements.
